Buried Imphal War Cemetery, Manipur State, India. Grave Ref: 7. K. 1. Attended the Ashford North County Modern (Boys) School from 1934 to 1936. Originally enlisted in the General Service Corps.

STONE, ANTHONY JOHN.

Died 24 March 1943. Aged 18

Son of Chief Yeoman of Signals, Samuel Stone (Royal Navy) and Mrs. S. E. Stone of Hill View, Brabourne, Ashford, Kent.

Attended the Ashford, Kent Grammar School from 1935 to 1938, where he is commemorated in the Second Word War Book of Rememberance.

Anthony was injured at Haywards Garage, New Street, Ashford, Kent, where he was employed, and died later the same day whilst a patient at Ashford, Kent Hospital.
