ANDERSON D.K

**Lieutenant Colonel Donald Knox ANDERSON MC. Machine Gun Corps (MGC). Formerly (Captain) The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1917.**

ANDERSON C.K

**Lieutenant Colin Knox ANDERSON. 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Queen's Own (Royal West Kent Regiment). Formerly 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion. Died 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1914.**

BUTLER F

**Corporal 72588 Frank BUTLER. Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) (M.G.C). Formerly (1831) Kent Cyclist Battalion. Died 5<sup>th</sup> May 1918. Born Newnham, Kent. Enlisted Canterbury.**

The village memorial lists Frank as a Private but SDGW gives him as a Corporal.

DUTNALL H

**Lance Corporal G/19274 Henry DUTNALL. 11<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Queen's Own (Royal West Kent Regiment). Formerly (2480) Royal East Kent Mounted Rifles (Yeomanry) (REKMR). Died 26<sup>th</sup> July 1917. Born Sittingbourne. Enlisted Canterbury.**

FORD C.S

**Private 13676 Cecil Stanley FORD. 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Grenadier Guards. Died 20<sup>th</sup> October 1914. Born Bridge, Kent. Enlisted Canterbury.**

FORD F.J

**Sergeant F.J FORD. The Buffs (East Kent Regiment) – NO TRACE**

The Medal Index Cards list a – Private G/5608 F FORD. The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). This man is not listed as a war casualty so presumably he survived the war. It is possible that after discharge he died of wounds or of some kind of disease. The trustees of the memorial may have allowed his name to go forward on this basis.

FOSTER A.H

**Private 784937 Arthur Harold FOSTER. Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (Eastern Ontario Regiment). Died Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> October 1917 aged 36 years. Born Stoney Creek, Ontario, Canada 8<sup>th</sup> December 1881. Enlisted Dundas**

11<sup>th</sup> March 1916. Son of William and Emma Foster of Ripple Vale, Ripple, Dover, Kent. Formerly residing at Filmer House, Bridge, Canterbury, Kent. Arthur has no known grave. His name appears on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ypres, Belgium. Panel reference 10 to 58.

Educated Ashford Grammar School, Ashford, Kent.

Arthur's name also appears on the Ripple War Memorial and on the Ashford Grammar School War Memorial.

HARVEY W.C

**Private 21379 William Charles HARVEY. 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, East Surrey Regiment.** Died 25<sup>th</sup> September 1915. Born Royston, Hertfordshire. Enlisted Canterbury.

JONES F.C

**Private G/1377 Frederick Charles JONES. 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment).** Died 12<sup>th</sup> May 1915. Born Bridge. Enlisted Ramsgate. Resided Bridge.

MANN A.J

**Lance Corporal 18384 Arthur John MANN. 13<sup>th</sup> Battalion, East Surrey Regiment.** Died 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1918. Born Bridge. Enlisted Kingston-Upon-Thames.

MANN W.J

**Private 1150 Walter James MANN. 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Northumberland Fusiliers.** Died 15<sup>th</sup> October 1914. Born Aldborough, Yorkshire. Enlisted Canterbury.

PERKINS C.E

**Chief Petty Officer (CPO) SS.105825(C) Charles Edward PERKINS. HMS "Aboukir". Royal Navy (RN).** Died 22<sup>nd</sup> September 1914.

PEIRCE C.H

**Lance Corporal G/5502 Charles Henry PEIRCE. 8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment).** Died 12<sup>th</sup> February 1916. Born Bishopsbourne. Enlisted Canterbury. Resided Bridge.
