**Lych Gate.**—On Sunday, Nov. 14th, at 3 p.m., in fine weather, at last our War Memorial was dedicated. The service was all at the Lych Gate, and the choir are to be congratulated on the way they sang the hymns unaccompanied. General Haig, C.M.G., unveiled the 2 panels with the list of names and spoke from personal knowledge in France of the wonderful courage and heroism of the men who had given their lives in the cause of freedom, and he reminded the ex-service men how thankful they should be for their safe return. He hoped that there would be an annual service at the Lych Gate, and that as men passed through the Gate they would raise their hats in honour of their fallen comrades. The Lych Gate was then dedicated by the Military Chaplain from Canterbury (Rev. F. P. Read,) and after the Roll of Honour had been read the "Last Post" was sounded. During the singing of the hymn "On the Resurrection Morning," relatives and friends placed their floral offerings on the stone seats beneath the names of their loved ones. A laurel wreath was placed there on Armistice Day by the Comrades and another one from the Ickham Wolf Cubs. After the Blessing the "Reveille" was sounded, and a memorable service concluded with the National Anthem.
