Edward Mannock

It is not widely known that before the outbreak of the Great War Edward Mannock then residing in Canterbury was a member of the Royal Army Medical Corps (Volunteers) at Canterbury. In 1912 Edward left the UK for Turkey where he was employed as a telephone engineer. Upon the outbreak of war Edward was taken into custody by the Turks and then eventually repatriated to the UK. Upon returning home Edward went straight to Ashford where he joined up with his former Territorial Force army unit which had been headquartered at The Drill Hall, Newtown Road, Ashford (2nd Home Counties Field Ambulance). Edward was almost immediately promoted Sergeant Major and attached to B Section. Edward billeted in Ashford during this period at 66 New Street. In March 1916 Edward was gazetted a Second Lieutenant in the Royal Engineers. He didn't remain in the Engineers for long. On 1st April 1916 Edward again transferred this time to the Royal Flying Corps. The rest is history. Edward went on to become a very successful pilot eventually winning the DSO the MC and ultimately the Victoria Cross. He was killed in action on 26th July 1918.
