GATES, ALBERT HENRY. Corporal, 6291676.

2 nd Battalion, The Buffs (Royal East Kent Regiment).

Died 1 February 1945. Aged 29.

Burma Born and resided Kent.

Son of John Thomas Gates and Edith Alice Gates.

Husband of Hilma Amy Louvain Gates of Stalisfield, Ashford, Kent.

Commemorated on the Rangoon Memorial, Myanmar. Face 4.

Albert was killed in action during the attempted crossing by his battalion of the river Shweli, Burma.

LLOYD, ABRAHAM EDWARD. Leading Seaman, C/JX155279.

Royal Navy. H.M.L.S.T. 302.

Died 11 March 1944. Aged 23.

Son of Harry and Winifred Lloyd of Stalisfield, Ashford, Kent.

Buried Charing Cemetery, Ashford, Kent. Grave Ref: Grave 24A.

Brother of the next casualty commemorated.

H.M. Landing Ship Tank 302, that Abraham served on was built at the Charleston Shipyard, New York, U.S.A. in mid 1942, and went to Great Britain in November 1942. Out of 1,051 L.S.T. class ships built, over a thousand survived through the end of the Second World War, but H.M.L.S.T. 302 was wrecked East of Ostend, Belgium, on 5 November 1944.

LLOYD, ALBERT. Lance Corporal, CH/X109573.

Royal Marines.

Died 28 June 1947. Aged 23.

Son of Harry and Winifred Lloyd of Stalisfield, Ashford, Kent.

Husband of Elizabeth Ada Lloyd of Bermondsey, London.
