

Yalding



Situated six miles south-east of Maidstone, the parish church of St. Peter and St. Paul in the picturesque village of Yalding, was reported by several commentators as being quite literally unable to accommodate everybody, at the service which was held at the church on the afternoon of Sunday 31 October 1920. The service was the start of the proceedings which culminated with the dedication and unveiling of the village civic war memorial. Situated at the top of the main road in the village, the war memorial was designed by Cecil Burns, a brother of Captain Edgar Balfour Burns, of Riverside, Yalding, who had served in both of the Kent infantry regiments during the Great War. As with numerous war memorials around the county, notably to the middle and west of Kent, the memorial was executed by Burslems of Royal Tunbridge Wells. With Lieutenant Colonel Arthur W. Reid M.C., R.E., at their head, the ex-servicemen led the procession from the parish church to the war memorial, where another brief service of dedication was conducted by the Right Reverend John Harmer, D.D. (1857-1944), who was at that time the Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester. Pastor Palmer of the Baptist Church, Yalding read the lesson, prior to the unveiling of the war memorial by local and national hero, Lieutenant Colonel Arthur Drummond Borton, V.C., C.M.G., D.S.O., (1883-1933), who resided at Cheveney, Yalding. On Sunday 27 July 1952 another service was conducted at the village civic war memorial, on that occasion it was the re-dedication of the memorial, combined with the official unveiling of the names of those who lost their lives during the Second World War. It would be remiss not to make mention of two starkly difference facts appertaining to the Yalding civic war memorial, the first of which the village is quite rightly very proud, which locals who we spoke to were keen to point out.

Since the age of four the village of Yalding was the home of the famous poet Edmund Blunden M.C. (1896-1974), who came to Yalding in 1900 when his father Charles was appointed headmaster of the village Church of England primary school. Arguably best known for 'Undertones of War' which was published in 1928, it being the memoir of his experiences as a young officer serving in the 11th (Service) Battalion, (1st South Down) Royal Sussex Regiment, on the Western Front during the Great War, having enlisted in 1916 at the age of 20. A prolific literary editor and biographer, as well as Professor, Fellow and Tutor of English in Tokyo, Oxford and Hong Kong, Edmund often tarried at the Yalding civic war memorial, doubtless at which times he reflected on the names of the Great War fallen inscribed thereon, most of whom he would have known well from his time spent at the village school. In the parish church of SS Peter & Paul, Yalding is a window in memory of Edmund, at the window dedication service which was conducted on Friday 28 September 1979, he was quoted as being "a man of peace, kindly and unassuming, whom war impelled to be a soldier, and brought him a title of poet of peace and war." When the window had been dedicated, the event received coverage in the local and national press. Unfortunately another event at Yalding civic war memorial received even international press coverage in at least ten (possibly more) countries, twenty years after the window in memory of Edmund had been dedicated. Prior to a rededication service in 1979, Yalding Parish Council commissioned Burlite Ltd, The Stone Shop, East Farleigh, Maidstone, Kent, to clean and restore the war memorial. As we have viewed numerous examples of the work carried out by the company, doubtless it was outstanding when completed. Gordon Newton, the Managing Director of the company which had carried out the restoration work, quite literally drove past the war memorial a few days later, and found the memorial extensively vandalised. Some of the cretins of Kent had thrown eggs at the revered memorial, cut into the stone surface with a knife, and scratched their names into it and daubed it with paint; they had also urinated over the plaques commemorating men from the parish who died in the Great War and Second World Wars. The name Shana had been written over the stone in red crayon, and beer cans, cigarette butts and broken glass littered the surrounding ground. At no cost to Yalding, Gordon Newton's company refurbished the war memorial in time for its rededication. During our conversations with a number of kindly Yalding residents, it came as no real surprise to note their reticence to reflect on the events of the summer of 1979. Edmund Blunden M.C. is at rest in the churchyard of Holy Trinity Church, Long Melford, Suffolk. Lieutenant Colonel Arthur Drummond Borton, V.C., C.M.G., D.S.O., who unveiled the Yalding civic war memorial, is at rest in Hunton, Maidstone, Kent, burial ground. When mention of him was made at Yalding, the response was identical to that at Hunton, "never heard of him, are you sure he had a V.C?" which is probably also an indication of the lack of response from Hunton, (and elsewhere) in our efforts to get Arthur's grave a better headstone, or failing same to be allowed to at least clean it better.

Frederick had served in the South African Campaign (Second Boer War), and left the army (Time Expired) in 1904. The year after leaving the army, Frederick

married Miss Emily Eliza Wads on 3 April 1905 at the parish church of St.

Margaret's, Barming, Maidstone, Kent. On 5 June 1906, a son Albert Edward

was born to Frederick and Emily at Loose, Maidstone, Kent, which was where a

daughter Lilian Mary was also born on 17 February 1908. Another daughter was

born at Aylesford, Maidstone, Kent, on 28 October 1909. At the time of his army

recall Frederick said that he was employed as a General Labourer. After his

initial time spent in the United Kingdom, Frederick arrived on the Western Front

on 7 December 1914.

In 1900 he came to Wye Agricultural College and left in 1902 having obtained a P.A.S.I in 1901. After leaving Wye Ronald went to farm at Yalding, Kent. Upon the outbreak of the Great War Ronald enlisted in the Royal East Kent Yeomanry. Ronald was a keen cricketer and a member of the M.C.C at Lords, and was apparently a useful batsman for Eton in 1897 and 1898. The Agricola Club (Wye College), in 1917 was sending Ronald's mail to Laddingford, Yalding, Maidstone, Kent.

Although he was neither a native, nor a resident of Yalding at the time of his death, it would probably be fair to assume that Harry had spent the bulk of his life there. Harry has been added to the other 'Yalding' Lost Men casualties. It was noticed that all the casualties of both world wars with the surname Sedfe, came from the county of Kent.
